KINDLING BRIGHTER FUTURES: BDC'S CSR INITIATIVES IGNITE LIFELONG LEARNING

Demonstrating its commitment, the corporation has extended a helping hand to Nata Senior Secondary School and the Dyslexia & Social Support Services Botswana, aiming to empower individuals to embrace lifelong learning and adapt to an ever-changing world.

Following a fire outbreak at one of the form 4 boys' hostels at Nata Senior Secondary school, about hundred students lost their belongings. The Corporation together with its employees raised a wholesome **P55 000.00** for the replacement of items which were lost to the fire, including books, clothes, toiletries, bedding, mattresses, curtains, and school uniform.

Moreover, BDC has donated P20,000 worth of tablets to the Dyslexia & Social Support Services Botswana. Situated in Mmatseta village, this organisation offers remedial classes for children facing learning disabilities, particularly dyslexia. The tablets will play a pivotal role in enhancing the learning experience, providing audio-visual aids for students grappling with dyslexia, thereby improving their educational journey.

Recognising the prevalence of dyslexia, impacting 20% of students across schools of all age groups, as well as adults in the workplace, BDC emphasises its commitment to support inclusion. Dyslexia, a learning disorder involving difficulties in reading due to challenges in identifying speech sounds and relating them to letters and words, affects areas of the brain responsible for language processing.

As Botswana's leading investment agency, propelling commercial and industrial transformation in the economy, BDC firmly believes in contributing significantly to the communities it operates within.
